From the Rector

### THE CONSICOUSNESS OF GRACE

There is an icon in St. Catherine's Monastery, Sinai, which holds together in one picture a number of answers to the question of where God's inspiration is to be located. At first sight, the icon is about John the Evangelist composing his Gospel. The halo around John's head reminds us of his holiness and God's presence in his life. Above, there is the image of a dove: the Spirit being sent from heaven to overshadow John. On the other side of the icon, there is the figure of Prochorus, who is traditionally regarded as John's scribe. The figure appears to balance that of the Evangelist. So, inspiration is to be located in the hearing and recording as well as in the original speaking. In



the center of the icon there is a table; on this you can see the manuscript on which Prochorus is writing, thus affirming the importance of the written text. Yet, if you look closely, you can see the manuscript holds the words (in English translation): "In the beginning was the *Wo....*" The look on John's face is that of "How shall I put this?" The icon seems to be affirming that the text is still in the process of being composed (even in our own day), and so warns us against closing down the period of inspiration. Finally, underneath the table, you can see some rolled-up parchment—as yet unused—implying that there is more inspiration still to come. This icon brilliantly affirms God's inspiration, past, present, and future—God's presence above us, in us, and in those we affect by the words which we speak.

With this emphasis on the continuing presence of God among us, I ask you to consider the many examples of God's presence and inspiration in our midst. Consider for example, our beloved St. John's Church and the work of ministry to which we are all called to engage. In my work as priest and pastor I can point to countless examples of people whose path through life helps me keep on track, often because they themselves received life-giving encouragement from our corporate life together and the unending witness of so many. There is an obvious level of trust in the presence and connectedness of God, some of which is made visible in the hearts of God's many and varied people. We live in a world that is saturated with God's grace, and yet don't acknowledge as often as we should. How often do we hear someone say, "I love St. John's and am continually inspired by the wonderful people here!" But sometimes we forget to put our experience into words. One of the roles that a faithful disciple can have is to be the sort of person who can take the moment to condense God's grace into actions so that it can be seen, heard and spoken about by others. Poet and priest Gerard Manley Hopkins once wrote: "The world is charged with the grandeur of God; disciples are people where inspiration happens and who make grandeur

become visible." Making the grandeur of God visible! That fits in beautifully with our mission: "To Know Christ and To Make Him Known." *The consciousness of grace matters!* 

As we continue our journey in the season after the Epiphany, and look around the corner to the season of Lent, may we place special emphasis on our own consciousness of God's inspiration and share it?

The Finance and Stewardship Committees would like to offer a reminder in how parishioners and

friends of St. John's alike can give to support the vital work and ministry of our beloved Church.

The pandemic has encouraged many to use our virtual services. Due to Covid precautions the ushers are currently not passing a donation basket during in person services. There is a basket located in the Narthex and on a table as parishioners are leaving the church towards the parish hall exit.

With the increased number of parishioners using the St. John's website giving option the decision was made to no longer provide envelopes. The envelopes are costly and very few used them.

If you wish to make your donation with a check, it can be placed in one of the baskets provided at in-person services. Checks can also be mailed to the church. You may prefer to do this monthly to save postage. Please do not submit multiple checks. If the check is towards your pledge, it does not matter how many weeks it is for; multiple checks are unnecessary. Please provide your pledge envelope number in the memo area of the check along with the designation, if it is for something other than your pledge. If you do not have an assigned number, or do not know your number, please contact Mark Trautman in the Parish Office and he will provide one for you.

For those who wish to try the online giving, here is a tutorial:

- The website is www.stjohnsomerville.org
- Select *Giving*, click the little arrow
- Select Give Online Now
- You will be given two options: *Give Now* or *Sign In*
- If you select *Give Now* you will be asked to provide your information
- If you select *Create One*, you will create your Giving account. That will enable you to sign in whenever with your email and password
- Select One-Time or Recurring
- Recurring enables you to set up the frequency and start date of a donation
- Select Fund General Budget or Toward My Pledge



• Click Submit and you will receive a confirmation. If you do not receive a confirmation, contact the Parish Office (stjohnsomerville@gmail.com, phone 908.722.1250). Thank you for your continued support of the mission and ministries of St. John's!

### PLANTING SEEDS OF HOPE AND FAITH

PLANTING SEEDS for future fruit is both an act of hope and an expression of faith. We plant in hope that the small seeds will one day produce a tree whose fruit will bless future generations. We plant in faith by entrusting those who follow us to nurture our tree, harvest the fruit properly and use it for the best purposes.

Making a planned gift to our church is a similar undertaking. A planned gift is a seed whose promised fruit will support St. John's well beyond our lifetime. Planned giving is often part of an overall estate plan to distribute your assets and possessions to the people and causes most dear to you. Planned gifts come in several forms. The simplest planned gift is to make a bequest to St. John's



in your will. Other options, such as charitable gift annuities through the Episcopal Church Foundation, provide a guaranteed income for life and substantial tax savings.

Planned gifts are funded from the assets you have accumulated during your lifetime. When you make a planned gift to the church, it typically does not impact your current income. In fact, there are several types of life-income gifts that can actually supplement your income for the rest of your life.

Planned gifts are generally used to foster the long-term health of the church. These gifts empower ministry beyond what is possible through annual operating funds. They provide future parishioners with the means to continue to worship, learn, and serve the community and the world as we have been blessed to do.

Planned giving is a powerful opportunity to ensure your most sacred values and commitments are part of your legacy. Your planned gift represents your hope for the future mission of our church and your faith in generations to come. We hope you'll prayerfully consider St. John's during your estate planning so that your dreams—and the dreams of others—might live on well into the future.

The Vestry had its first meeting of the year on January 19.
