#### From the Rector

YOUR DISCIPLESHIP MATTERS IN YOUR LIFE AND AT ST. JOHN'S!

DISCIPLESHIP BECKONS US, CALLS US, INVOLVES US, to go out there into the world, the soccer field, coffee shops, local restaurants, schools, libraries, churches, your next-door neighbors' home, dinner parties and so many other places, where profound things are going on in the lives of other people. Being a disciple can be the way that allows others to begin to see faith in a whole new way. It could be that some are saying, "If you gently lead me, I will follow," or "Please model for me the Christian priorities that matter most to you," or "Please put into words what I am just beginning to feel." When a disciple exemplifies and boldly proclaims love, it can be liberating to someone who




has not experienced justice and peace. When a disciple opens up his or her heart, it can be life-giving to someone who has given up hope. When a disciple is compassionate, understanding, and faithful in their use of words or actions, when they create an environment where people can feel safe, welcomed, and appreciated, one that resonates with those not familiar with the Christian tradition, then they are producing a divine Broadway play for which is experienced as balm or life-giving medicine to their soul.

If we reflect on it, the Church is a theatre of meaning, and all actors need to keep in mind that the audience matters more than the actors themselves. The connection between theatre and Church, with disciples being actors of faith, is a theme that is front and center in our common life here at St. John's. We pray that the person who comes to our Church hears the Good News of Jesus Christ. We pray the newcomer feels welcomed, accepted, loved and appreciated.

We are all actors—disciples who are called to influence those around us in holy, faithful and positive ways. Indeed, it may be imperative to think of ourselves as public actors for the faith, housed in a theatre of meaning, the Church, and putting on a divine Broadway play for which there is an eager audience. The audience may be made up of people from other faith traditions or none, some who have never set foot in a church building before, people who were mistreated in another church, people who are ready to learn more about infusing their daily life with faith. So often we find people don't know which way to turn. Actors point them to a healthy community of faith. Actors help others remember to turn to God. Actors seek to bring light and joy into another person's life. *Are you an actor? Are you a disciple witnessing the love of Jesus?* Invite a friend, neighbor or family member to St. John's this Sunday.

Our Diocesan Bishop, The Rt. Rev. Sally Johnson French, will be here at St. John's on Sunday, January 21, 2024 to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation and to Receive people into The Episcopal Church.

<sup>1</sup> I invite you to consider the calling of the Holy Spirit to be Confirmed or Received into The Episcopal



Church or Re-affirm your baptismal vows. I was baptized six months after I was born and I was Confirmed when I was in the seventh grade. How about you? When were *you* baptized? Were you confirmed? Are you a life-long Episcopalian? Have you already been baptized and confirmed? Or perhaps, you came from another faith tradition or denomination. Have you been officially "received" into The Episcopal Church? Perhaps you have not heard God calling you until *now*! Would you consider re-affirming your baptismal vows? The time is *now* to listen to what the Holy Spirit may be calling you to do. Whether you have been here for a long time or are brand new and would like to be confirmed, please let me know! A spiritual director I knew used to say that a "living, conscious and active faith in Jesus is a gift of God." I could not agree more. My relationship with God in Jesus Christ is the greatest gift in my life. Allow yourself an opportunity to seek a deeper relationship with God…a relationship founded in love. I think of this as any love process:

- 1. Falling in love;
- 2. A "getting to know you" phase;
- 3. A commitment to staying in love.

God is always there for us. God sustains us with grace. These three elements in any believer's involvement with Jesus Christ helps in understanding self, others, the Gospel and the mission of the Church. It helps us deal more appropriately with the moral challenges we face in daily life. Our faith journey is toward God. "Let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice" (Psalm 105:3). Perhaps St. Augustine said it best: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you" (*Confessions*, 1,1).

## **VESTRY NOMINATING COMMITTEE**

Annual Parish Meeting: Sunday, January 14, 2024 POSITIONS OPEN INCLUDE:

- One (1) Warden;
- Three (3) Vestry positions for three-year terms;
- Six (6) Representatives to Watchung Convocation for one year term;
- One (1) Deputy to Diocesan Convention for a three-year term;
- One (1) Alternate to Diocesan Convention for a three-year term.

#### CALLED TO SERVICE: VESTRY

#### What does the Vestry do?

It's the legal governing body of the parish, the "board of directors." With the rector as its leader, it sets policy and goals and oversees the finances and property. But it has another equally important role: providing leadership to implement the ministries that serve the parish and the community. It actively supports the work and ministry of the Rector.

#### WHO CAN RUN FOR VESTRY?

Any baptized member of the Episcopal Church who has been a member of our parish in good standing for at least one year, is at least 16 years old, makes a regular financial contribution to the parish, and worships regularly with us.

#### IS THERE AN EXPECTED TIME COMMITMENT?

Yes. A term runs for three years. The Vestry meets once every month. Vestry members are also members of either the Property Committee or Finance Committee. We have one all-day Vestry Retreat once a year. And since every vestry member's voice matters our goal is for members to have no more than three unexcused absences from regular meetings in a year.

#### WHAT DO WE LOOK FOR IN A VESTRY MEMBER?

Someone who is involved in some parish ministry, and preferably (but not necessarily) has shown some leadership ability. He or she should keep informed about the parish and be willing to contribute to working out solutions to issues that arise. Every Vestry member should work respectfully with other members and participate in discerning the parish's vision and encouraging its ministries. The Vestry affords people the opportunity to share a variety of their own gifts and talents.

#### How are Vestry members chosen?

They are nominated by the Nominating Committee, whose recommendation must be approved by the Vestry, and they are elected at the annual meeting.

#### How does the Nominating Committee work?

It accepts suggestions from parishioners, discusses possible candidates, decides who it thinks should be nominated, makes sure people are willing to run, and presents a proposed slate to the Vestry. The approved nominees are then announced to the parish. Each nominee will then be asked to prepare a statement of qualifications of no more than 100 words.



#### How can I nominate someone?

You may complete and give this form to Fr. Ron or a member of the Nominating Committee, or put it in the collection basket, or leave it with Mark Trautman in the Parish Office. You may nominate yourself or someone else.
