### From the Rector

Lent: An Intentional Spiritual Training Camp

JESUS SPENT A SIGNIFICANT AMOUNT OF TIME preparing Himself for His ministry by a period of fasting, praying, and strengthening Himself against temptation. How will we use the time offered to us in the liturgical season of Lent for our own spiritual training camp? Lent is a time to build up a healthy defense system against sin and temptation. Lent is a time of self-examination and repentance. Lent is a time to meditate on God's holy Word by prayer, fasting, and



self-denial. What spiritual training plans will we put into action during Lent. Perhaps we recall spiritual disciplines that helped us in the past. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are traditional. We are called upon to observe a holy Lent. Perhaps we spend a few minutes each day reading and reflecting upon Holy Scripture. Are we trying to live by "bread alone?" We might write a plan for each week of Lent. We are encouraged to be creative whatever our intentional "training" might be. Here are some suggestions:

- *First week: I will...*spend time reading and reflecting upon Holy Scripture, perhaps the Psalms or the Gospels.
- **Second week:** *I will...*fast from unhealthy food or drink, and instead infuse my body and soul with things that lead to a healthy life-style.
- *Third week: I will...*volunteer and/or support one of our mission outreach ministries, such as: Clothes Closet, Laundry Love, Meals To Go, or another life-giving ministry, such as: Episcopal Relief & Development, Somerset County Food Bank, etc.
- *Fourth week: I will...*intentionally memorize a few verses of Holy Scripture by heart.
- *Fifth week: I will...*give money, clothes, possessions to the poor.
- *Sixth week: I will...*participate in Holy Week liturgies. I will invite a friend, family member or neighbor to St. John's Church.

One last note, and the most important point: *We are not preparing for Good Friday*. We are preparing for Easter. We anticipate living in Christ in the joy of His Resurrection!

#### ASH WEDNESDAY February 14, 2024 "I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent." -BCP, page 265

All are cordially invited to receive ashes on Wednesday, February 14 at 7 am, 12 noon, or 7 pm at St. John's; Eucharist will also be celebrated at each service.



Ash Wednesday is not a Holy day of obligation, nor is the reception of ashes required of Episcopalians. Still, Ash Wednesday is a dearly held tradition by many in our beloved Anglican tradition.

Ash Wednesday marks the first day of Lent. Whether you receive ashes on Ash Wednesday or not, you are encouraged to follow the Liturgy of the Day, including a number of prayers, Scripture readings, and more. You can find the worship bulletin here: https://stjohnsomerville.org/sunday-bulletin/

This year, we will offer the traditional marking of the sign of the cross on the forehead and sprinkling with ashes as well. Sprinkling ashes on the top of peoples heads rather than marking foreheads with ashes, is a return to the original practice in the life of the Church.

Ashes are rich in symbolism. They remind us that God created us from the earth, and that we will return to it when we die. They also symbolize God's promise that even though our bodies will return to dust, our souls are meant to live forever with God.

In baptism, we are washed clean from sin and anointed as "priest, prophet, and king" on the top of our head. It is fitting that ashes, a reminder of our sin and of baptism into death, be sprinkled on the crown of our heads, because at Easter, we celebrate the Resurrection of Christ, the conquering of sin and death, and baptism into life.

In sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ, we commend to Almighty God our *brother/sister*, and we commit *his/her* body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust...yet even at the grave we make our song: Alleluia, alleluia. –*BCP*, *page* 499

## ASHES TO GO




## **Classes, Second Sunday of the Month**
