### Good Friday

Good Friday is the middle of the *Triduum*, the three-days' space starting with Maundy Thursday and ending at the Great Vigil of Easter on Holy Saturday. The name "Good" refers to an old understanding of the word as "pious" or "holy." Today is also known as "Holy Friday" or "Great Friday." The Eucharist is not celebrated on this day.

The Gospels record seven "words" or sayings that Jesus spoke from the cross as he was being crucified. A three-hour midday service with special prayers and sermons around these sayings is said to have been used in Peru following a devastating earthquake in the seventeenth century. Since then, many Anglican, Protestant, and Roman Catholic communities have used this form to commemorate Good Friday.

We invite you this evening to pray, sing, listen to the silence, and reflect as we contemplate Christ's mighty act of redemption on the Cross.

Reader

When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "Listen, he is calling for Elijah." And someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink, saying, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down." Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, "Truly this man was God's Son!"
