From the Rector

#### 'THE DAY THE CRAYONS QUIT'

I RECENTLY READ A BOOK ENTITLED: The Day the Crayons Quit by Drew Daywalt and Oliver Jeffers (published by Harper Collins: www.drewdaywalt.com/the-day-the-crayons-quit). It is an extraordinary story of a young boy named Duncan and his box of very unhappy crayons who decide to quit! The story goes like this: one day Duncan takes out his crayon box and opens it, he is shocked at what he sees. The crayons are all gone. Someone didn't steal them or misplace them, rather the crayons left on their own volition. They went on



strike. Next to where the box of crayons typically live, there was a pile of letters addressed to Duncan from each of the crayons. Each crayon bravely communicated the issues they faced and all the trouble they had with the way they were being used. For example, red was exhausted because every Christmas and Valentine's Day, everyone uses it and colors everything with it (Santas, hearts, etc.). Blue also expressed being overused, becoming worn down and short. White was very depressed because it was rarely ever used, except to fill in blank spaces. So was pink. Purple, grey, orange, yellow, peach—all still other colors shared their concerns. In a nut shell, some crayons felt overworked, some under-appreciated, some had identity issues, felt misunderstood, or simply wanted to do things other than what Duncan wanted them to do!

Duncan felt bad for his crayons. Duncan tried to please the crayons, and so used Black to paint the beach, and then gave beige and white new things they could color, but he does not resolve all the problems of the other crayons. Duncan wants his crayons to be happy and fulfilled. Duncan does not want his crayons to be sad or unrecognized. Duncan wants his crayons to feel appreciated. Duncan creatively thinks ahead about an upcoming assignment and gives new jobs to the various colors. In the end, even Duncan feels good about his decision to incorporate all the colors in non-traditional ways. Duncan's teacher applauds Duncan's creativity as he proceeds forward utilizing the talents of all the colors in a common mission. It is as if, Duncan celebrates the qualities of each crayon while holding on to the pursuit of beautiful and newly reinvented artwork. Duncan is extraordinarily pleased to see that art has no boundaries and the journey is always a process of creativity and reinvention.

I can't help but wonder how you might feel about what color you most closely identify with and to what extent you contribute to the mission of our Church here at St. John's: "To Know Christ and To Make Him Known?" It might be an interesting exercise to discuss our unique perspectives. How might you relate this story to your own life? Your family? Your education in school or college? Your work? Your ministry? What comes to mind after becoming familiar with this story? What issues and concerns are you most mindful of? How can I help? How can the Church help? How can we help one another as a community

of faith as we begin a new year? As our praying shapes our believing, in its repetition and consistency, how can the use of your crayon not only contribute to the building up of God's Kingdom, but your own discipleship and ministry?

The Day the Crayons Quit is actually not a book about crayons that quit—but about crayons that have some real concerns and have a desire to express them. This is an excellent lesson in communication, expressing needs, walking in some else's shoes, and

realizing that negotiations can bring about change and conflict resolution, which can be applied to all aspects of our lives and our ministries. I encourage you to incorporate these concerns into your prayer life. I encourage you to bring these concerns to the Altar when you receive communion, that by God's grace you will gain deeper insight, see things in new and creative ways, and with a deeper desire "To Know Christ and To Make Him Known."


